Enference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Levi Conover, who served from New Jersey and received pension while a resident of Adair County, Kentucky.

Levi Comever was bern October 10, 1757, in Middlesex County, New Jersey; the names of his parents are not shown. His brothers, William and John, served in the Revolutionary War also.

Endle a resident of Windsor Township, Middlesex County,

Hew Jersey, Levi Cenever belenged to Captain Samual Stout's company
of New Jersey militia just after the burning of the tea in Boston,
was called out and served on various monthly tours under Celenals
Daychinok and Hyer in the years 1775 and 1776, was in the battle of
Trenten and Princeten, after which he served six menths in Captain
Hicksen's company of horse, during which he was in many skirmishes
in the vicinity of Brunswick and Elizabeth Towns after 1777, he
served on different tours in his brether's, Captain William Conever's
company under Calonale Mislam and William Soudder in the New Jersey
troops during the remainder of the war; his entire service amounted
to at least three years. Levi Conever stated that his brether, William 1717-w
Conever, served with him under Captain Samual Stout, and that when this
Captain Stout resigned, William was commissioned captain of that Wold
Company.

William Conover continued to reside in Wigdsey Township, Middlesex County, New Jersey, for about eight years after the Revolutionary Mar, moved them to Fayette County, Kentucky, where he resided about eight years, then moved to Adair County, Ventucky (formerly in Orean

County).

Levi Genever was allowed pension on his application excented angust 9_{\circ} 1833, at which time he resided in Adair Gently, Kentucky; he had resided there since about 1793.

The seldier made me reference to wife or children.

One Peter J.(1)Comever resided in Adair County, Kentucky, in 1833, but did not state any relationship to the soldier's family; he signed his name Comever.

Levi Conover, the pensioner, died January 18, 1837.
