State of Kentucky Adams County, Sep
on this 10th day of August 1832 pers
onally appeared in open Court before
the worshippful Justices of Adams County
Court now sitting Jacob Cooper
a Resident of the County of Adams
of and State of Kentucky aged 98
years who being first duly sworn
according to Law doth on his Oath
make the following declaration in
order to obtain the benefit of
the act of Congress passed 7th June
1832 that he entered the service of
the United States in the Revolutionary
war under Capt. William Moore
in the year 1776 in the County of
Banks in the State of North Carolina
in the Regiment of Col. Pickens
Genl. Nathurford's Brigade he remained
in said Regiment for several months
having marched to Cape Fear kept in
the service was then placed under
the command of Col. Charles McNew
all and in the Company of Capt. Thom
as Hinney while in that Comp
any was in a battle with the British
in South Carolina on the waters of
Broad River he was then marched to
Waxfords Iron works in South Carolina
then he was marched to the State
of North Carolina & was discharged

His days making in the whole twelve
months he again entered the service
after having been a while at home
in the Company of Capt Joseph McPhee
and attached to the same Regiment
where he served until the close of
the war - making in the whole, including
any the various engagements upwards
of two years but from his extreme
old age and infirmity he cannot
recollect the particular incidents
further than he has stated only
six months he served as an Indian
Spies under Capt William ^{of Moon} ~~Moore~~
he had discharges for all his services
But some years ago his house
was burnt at which time all
his discharges & papers was likewise
burnt he knows of no witness by
whom he can prove the acts of service
except a part he could prove
by Capt Hadden who he is informed
is yet living tho a considerable dist
ance from him and he is not
able to go to the residence of said
Hadden the distance being upwards
of eighty miles he hereby challenges
every claim whatever to a pension or
annuity except the present and declares
that his name is not on the Pension
Roll of the agency of any State

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Jacob Cooper of Burke County, North Carolina.

The data furnished herein relative to Jacob Cooper were obtained from papers on file in pension claim, S. 12604, based upon his service in the War of the Revolution.

The date and place of birth of Jacob Cooper were not given, nor were the names of his parents stated.

Jacob Cooper enlisted in Burke County, North Carolina in the year 1776, served as Indian Spy and private in Captain William Moore's company in Colonel Beckman's North Carolina regiment, and Captain Thomas Kennedy's company in Colonel Charles McDowell's North Carolina regiment, was in the battle of Broad River in South Carolina, length of service twelve months. He, again, enlisted, date not given, served as a private in Captain Joseph McDowell's company in Colonel Charles McDowell's regiment, on various tours until the close of the war, amounting to one year.

He was allowed pension on his application executed August 10, 1832, at which time he was living in

Adair County, Kentucky, aged ninety-eight years.

The papers on file in this claim contain no reference to the family of the soldier, Jacob Cooper.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, name and address of person paid, and possibly the date of death of this pensioner, you should apply to The Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D. C., and furnish the following data:
