Declaration of Zachariah Holladay  
State of Kentucky  
Adair County

(On this ~~10<sup>th</sup>~~ day of ~~August~~ 1832,  
personally appeared before the justices  
of County Court of Adair County and  
State of Kentucky aged 71 years, who being  
first duly sworn according to law, doth, on  
his oath, make the following declaration in  
order to obtain the benefit of the provision made  
by the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832,  
that he entered in the Army of the United  
States in the year 1778 with Capt Burnley and  
served in the regiment of Guards that were to  
guard Burgoyne's prisoners; the No. of Regiment  
not recollects of the Virginia line under the  
following named officers. Col. Francis Taylor  
Commander of the Regiment. Maj. Roberts left  
the service in April 1781 by discharge from  
Col. Taylor. He states that he was a regular  
soldier and was drummer, principal post  
of the time at the request of Capt Burnley  
the very same day that he was discharged he  
enlisted & the fall following was at the command  
of Cornwallis and afterwards was in the  
Carolina's to the South under Gen. Clayton  
who gave a regular discharge from Gen. Clayton  
the tour under his last command was  
about 18 months. He states he lived in service  
Orange County Virginia - when he entered the

~~He~~ states that when he left Virginia to remove to Kentucky he left all his discharges in Virginia & has never seen them from that day to this. He has no documentary evidence & therefore knows of no person by whom he can prove his services -

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state.
