Reference is made to your letter in which you request the record of Jaromich Ingram, a Revolutionary War pensioner of Kentucky, your request being in behalf of Imagene B. Brown, R. R. # 5, Ecz 181-B, Torre Haute, Indiana, Those letter you enclosed.

The record of Jaromiah Increm follows as found in the papers of pension claim, S. 15186, based upon his service in the Revolutionary Wer.

The date and place of birth of Jeremiah Ingram and names of his parents are not shown.

Jeremich Ingrem enlisted in 1776, place not stated, served as private in Captains David Encom's, Gregory's and White's companies, Colonels David Encom's, Innis', Abraham Buford's and Enasell's Virginia regiments, and was discharged about December 1, 1779, having served three years.

The soldier was allowed pension on his application executed August 9, 1832, at which time he was agod seventy-three years and a resident of Adair County, Kentucky.

No reference was made in the claim to wife or children.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name and address of the person paid and possibly the date of death of Jeremiah Ingram, Immagene B. Brown should write to the Comptroller General General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, end cits the following data: Jeremiah Ingrem, certificate (7004), Issued February 29, 1833, rate (20 per annum, commanded March 4, 1831, Act June 7, 1832, Kontucky Agency.
