5th Pennsylvania Regiment commanded by Col.

Linn born in Capt Benjamin Beattie's house born
1775 and in the Pennsylvania line served the state
of the original colonies named in before our Independence
on the day of

18. And the No of the pension cer-
tificate is 16122 and I do solemnly swear that I was a
resident citizen of the United States on the 15th day of March
1818 and that I have not since that time by gift
sale or in any manner disposed of my property or
any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish
it as to bring myself within the provisions of an
Act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain per-
sons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the
United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the
15th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has
any one in trust for me any property or securities
the debts contracts due to me nor have I any
income other than what is contained in the
Schedule hereto annexed and by me Subscribed
