<b>Notes</b> HUSBAND - Benjamin F RUBARTS Known as "Wild Ben". Copied from Casey newspaper : "Deputy Sheriff Gibony, on the 15th inst. arrested three men a few miles below Liberty, on South Fort Creek, two by the names of Piles and one named Ben Ruberts. They were detected in having formed a conspiracy to rob K. L. Tanner's Store and several wealthy citizens in that section. Rupert stands charged with several other offenses, and is known as a desperate character in that portion of the county. It is supposed that he is united with several others. He was indicted about a year ago for grand larceny, gave bond for his appearance which he forfeited. RUBERT indicted for horse stealing He stole from Mary PILE, 3-10-1875, one horse the value of \$100. Indicted for Larceny. Mary Pile, Wm. Pile, Floyd Pile and Henry Craig witnesses for the state. L. T. Smith, Clerk, W. S. Hill foreman of Grand Jury. p. 466 Ruberts appears in court with court assigned lawyer Wm. A. Murry and A. M. Garrett. Found guilty by jury, sentenced to ten years in prison. He ask for a new trial p.494 Request for a new trial denied. He is to start the ten year term March 30 1875. He was defranchised and must pay the cost of the trile.  ----- He is said to have murdered a salesman and buried him under his porch. He is supposed to have died in Federal penitentiary in Indiana; buried in potters field. I did find him listed in the penitentiary in Franklin county, Kentucky in a special 1890 Kentucky census book in the Sherman, Texas library. This was a special census of union veterans. I do not believe this Benjamin served and has been confused with my great grandfather Benjamin Rubarts, who served in Co. I of the 13th KY Cavalry.
