On this day personally app
eared before me the undersigned a Justice of
the peace and for the County aforesaid
Elizabeth Perry a Resident of the County of
Boone State of Kentucky aged 72 years who
being first duly sworn according to Law doth
for her self make the following Declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the Provisions
made by the Act of Congress passed July 7th
1838 entitled an Act granting half pay and
Pensions to certain Widows that she is the Widow
of Lot Garry who was a Private Soldier on
the Virginia Line during the war of the
Revolution and was placed on the Pension
roll in Gallatin County Kentucky under
the Law of Congress March the 18th 1818 and was
in a short time stricken from the Pension
Roll in consequence of his Possessing two Much
Property and she refers to the papers on file
for evidence of his services she was married
as she further declares to the said Lot
Garry in Richmond County Virginia by
on the seventh day of ~~July~~ ^{September} 1800
and Eighty One and her husband aforesaid
Lot Garry died on the twentieth day of
January 1837 and she was not married to
him prior to his leaving the services but
the marriage took place previous to the first
of January sixteen hundred and ninety four
(1794) at the time above stated and she has rem-
ained a widow ever since the death of her
husband the said Lot Garry as will more
fully appear by Reference to the proof hereto
annexed and she Presents her Family Record

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your request for the Revolutionary War record of Job Garvey.

The data furnished herein were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, W. 8839, based upon the military service of Job Garvey, the only soldier by that name that is found in the Revolutionary War records of this office.

Job Garvey enlisted in Westmoreland County, Virginia, about 1777, served as private in Captains Richard Barnett's and Henry Fountleroy's Virginia companies; was in the battles of Monmouth, Paulus Hook, in the siege of Charleston and the siege of Fort Mifflin and was in a skirmish with the Indians near Savannah, Georgia, under General Anthony Wayne and was discharged in 1783. He later enlisted and served eighteen months in Captain Warman's Virginia company.

He was allowed pension on his application executed October 26, 1818, while a resident of Gallatin County, Kentucky, then aged fifty-eight years.

He died January 20, 1827.

This soldier married February 7, 1781, in Richmond County, Virginia, Elisabeth, her maiden name not given.

She was allowed pension on her application executed September 13, 1838, while a resident of Owen County, Kentucky, at which time she was seventy-two years of age.
