Increased to \$2<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> per mo. by Law  
24 April, 1816. And, increased  
by the Secretary of War to \$8. per  
mo. to commence 23<sup>rd</sup> Oct. 1822  
on the 18 January, 1823.

Certificate of pension issued  
18 January, 1823 & sent to Lieut.  
Comdr. of Lexington, Kentucky  
now in Washington City.

And from 1<sup>st</sup> Sep. to 23 Oct. 1822  
at \$2<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> per mo. 56<sup>7</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 3. 4. 20  
And from 23 Oct. 1822 to - - -

Dear Sir

As the attorney in fact for the heirs of Andrew Green deceased who is enrolled on the pension list as an invalid pensioner of the Revolution, Registered in Book B. Vol. 10. page 8. by William Hickey Clerk. Ex. I count signed by J. L. Edwards.

The original certificate is as follows to wit  
Increased Pension

The allowance of the within named pensioner is hereby authorized to be increased from \$2,100<sup>00</sup> per mo. to which his pension was raised by the law of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1816 to the rate of Eight dollars per month to commence from the twenty third of October 1822 Given at the War office the 18<sup>th</sup> of January 1823

The above named Andrew Green departed this life on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1823. His last draw was made in the year 1821 or 22. This requires an order from J. L. Edwards agent at Washington City and I'm not advised what course I am to take but so far as the papers can be prepared I have them ready &c but two years having elapsed between the time at which the pensioner made his last draw and the present time, I have to call on you for an order I presume to the Pension Agent at Lexington Kentucky. I do not know what authority you give the order here you will please let me know which will be a

peculiar favour in deed.

ORIGINAL CLAIM.

I, *Robert Lumb* Judge of the District Court of the United States of America, for the *Kentucky* District; by AUTHORITY of an act of Congress, passed the 25th day of April, 1812, entitled "An act to revive and continue in force an Act to provide for persons who were disabled by known wounds received in the Revolutionary war, and for other purposes," DO HEREBY

BY ESPECIALLY AUTHORIZE AND COMMISSION *Thomas P. Lattenwhite* of the county of *Kentucky* and district of *Kentucky*

*Trayette*

to take all evidence pursuant to the rules and regulations of the said act, for substantiating the claim of *Saharal Williams* of the town of *Kentucky* in the county of *Kentucky*

to be placed on the Pension List of the United States, by reason of known wounds received in said war, or since, (as prescribed in the fourth section of "An act concerning invalid pensioners," passed the 25th of April, 1808,) while in the actual service of the United States, and in the line of his duty. And when the same shall be completed, to return the evidence, affidavits, certificates, and proceedings had hereupon, together with this commission, to the Secretary for the Department of War.

INCREASE OF PENSION.

United States.

To Doctor *Charles Henry Warfield*  
of *Lexington Ky* and  
Doctor *Thomas P. Salter* of

County of said district.

Pursuant to an act of Congress of the United States, passed the 25th of April, 1812, entitled "An act to revive and continue in force 'An act to provide for persons who were disabled by known wounds received in the Revolutionary war, and for other purposes," you are hereby appointed and authorized to examine *Andrew Green*

who is inscribed on the Pension List of the United States, and is claimant for an increase of pension, conformably to the 5th section of the act of the 10th April, 1806, revived as aforesaid; and you are to report, in writing, and on oath or affirmation, your opinion of the nature of his disability and in what degree it prevents him from obtaining a subsistence by manual labor; and in your proceedings in the premises you are to be regulated and governed by said act.
