State of Kentucky Gallatin Circuit Ct.

On this twenty-fourth day of August 1818
before me the subscriber one of the Circuit Judges
for the State aforesaid abutting to the said Circuit, personally
appeared Alexander M. Danell aged thirty three years nineteen
in the County of Gallatin in the said Circuit, who being
by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth on
his oath make the following declaration in order to
obtain the pension made by the late Act of Congress
entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in
the land and naval service of the United States in the
Revolutionary War. That he the said Alexander Danell
enlisted in Maryland serving in the State of Pennsylvania
in the Company commanded by Captain James Miller
of the 8th Pennsylvania Regiment commanded by
Cato McKay, that he continued to serve in said Corps or in
the service of the United States until the 18th day of Nov.
1779 when he was discharged from service in the Town
of Pittsburgh in the State of Pennsylvania as will appear
by his discharge hereunto annexed - That he was in the
Battle of Brandywine under Captain Miller in the 8th
Regt. of Pennsylvania commanded by Cato Broadhead
where he was slightly wounded - & that he was in the
Battle of Germantown under the same officers - and
that he is reduced in circumstances and stands in need
of the assistance of his country for support and that
he has no other evidence now in his possession or
power of his said services -

State of Kentucky Fayette Circuit Court June
Term 1821. 20th day of June 1821

Be it remembered that on this day personally
appeared in open Court Alexander M. Dowell, who
produced in Court his Schedule Declaration
and Schedule threats annexed of his property
amounting to Forty four Dollars to which he
made oath agreeably to the act of Congress
concerning pensions, which is therupon ordered
to be entered of Record as follows

District of Kentucky ss.

Fayette Circuit Court.

On this 20th day of June 1821 personally appeared
in open Court, being a Court of Record, for the
said District, and Circuit of Fayette County,
Alexander M. Dowell aged sixty six years
resident in said County, in said District,
who being first duly sworn, according to law
doth, on his oath, declare, that he served in
the Revolutionary War as follows: He enlisted
in the State of Pennsylvania, West Moreland
County for three years in Captain Samuel C.
Matthew Company in the 8th (Pennsylvania)
Regiment Commanded by Colonel McGoy
that he served out ~~at least~~ three years and
was honorably discharged at Pittsburgh
then called "Fort Pitt" that his original
Declaration the 24th day of August 1818 and
his Pension certificate No 8887. And I do solemnly swear
that I was a resident citizen
of the United States on the 18th day of March
1818, and that I have not since that time

by gift, sale or in any manner, disposed of
my property or any part thereof, with intent
thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself
within the Provisions of an Act of Congress
entitled "An Act to Provide for certain Persons
engaged in the Land and Naval service
of the United States in the Revolutionary
War passed on the 18th day of March 1818,
and that I have not nor have any person
in Trust for me any property or securities
Contracts or Debts due to me nor have, &
any income other than what is contained
in the Schedule hereto annexed and by
me subscribed.
