Do not remember that on the 28th day of August 1821 Daniel
Lewins made affidavit in open court and produced
Schedule of his property amounting to two dollars equally
to an act of Congress of the first of May 1820 concerning
pensioners which was ordered to be entered of record in the
following words and figures to wit

State of Kentucky Circuit Court - Oct
On this 28th day of August 1821 personally appeared
before the said Circuit Court in open court which is
a court of record according to the laws of this common-
wealth Daniel Lewins who is then aged sixty seven years
next Christmas and resident of Gallatin County Kentucky
who being first sworn by the Honorable Henry Danvers
Judge of the said Court according to the law
did take the following oath prescribed by the act
of Congress of the first of May 1820 to wit

I Daniel Lewins do solemnly swear that I served in the
revolutionary war as follows. I first served under
Captain Rhinehart as a militiaman and was taken
prisoner on Long Island from which I made my escape
in a canoe and then enlisted three years or during the
war in Col. Otho Williams Regiment of Philadelphia
my Capt was Thomas Barry a Peacher under whom I
served for about three years. It was then taken into Genl
Washingtons life Guard as a horseman under Capt
Wardner where I served until the surrender of
Comwallis. I was in the Battle of Germantown &
Red Bank, Brandy wine, and Springfield &
I was discharged by Genl Washington after the surrender
of Comwallis and I do further solemnly swear I was
a resident citizen on the 18th day of March 1818 and that
I have not since that time by gift sale or in any
manner disposed of my property or any part
thereof with intent thereby to diminish it or to bring
myself within the provisions of an act of Congress
intitl'd an act to provide for certain persons engaged
with land and naval service of the United States
during the Revolutionary war passed on the 18th of
March 1818 and that I have not nor any person

in trust for me any property or security contracts or debts
due to me nor have I any income other than what
is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by
me subscribed to wit a schedule of the
property the whole estate and income of said
decedent referred to in the aforesaid oath and
declaration is as following, no property except a pair
tools worth about Ten Dollars which this affiant
is too old and defective in sight to use.

And the said David sworn doth further certify
and declare on oath that he has no wife or children
to aid him in procuring a subsistence

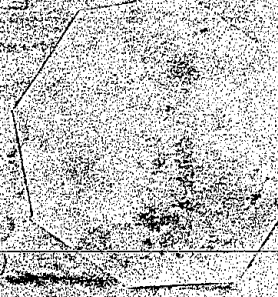
