On this 12th day of Oct^r 1821, personally appeared and
appeared ^{as a} ^{trustee} ^{of} ^{the} ^{estate} ^{of} ^{the} ^{deceased} ^{of} ^{the} ^{County} ^{of} ^{Gallatin} ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{District} ^{of} ^{Kentucky}
and Circuit of Gallatin County, Cyrus Tubbs, aged 61
years a resident in Gallatin County in said District
who being first ^{and} sworn according to law doth on
his oath declare that he served in the revolution any
war as follows: That he entered in the year 1777
first year by the Company commanded by Capt
Woodbridge in the 8th Connecticut Regiment
commanded by Col. Heyman first in the
Connecticut Continental line and that he served in
said Regiment until his term expired in the year
1780. At which time he was honorably discharged
by said Col. first in the State of New Jersey
that he was in the battle of Germantown
Monmouth and many points and that his discharge
is lost and that he has never applied for
a pension before and that there is no other
evidence now in his power of said service
and I do solemnly swear that I, as a resident
citizen of the United States on the 18th day of
March 1818 and that I have not since that
time by gift sale or in any manner disposed
of my property or any part thereof with intent
to diminish it as by being myself
within the provisions of an act of Congress
"entitled an act to provide for certain
persons engaged in the land and naval service of
the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on
the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not now
has any person in trust for me any property or securities
contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income
other than what is contained in the schedule hereto
annexed and by me subscribed
