On this the 5th day
of August 1832 personally appeared before the
Justices Composing the County Court of Henry
County being a Court of Record in the State
of Kentucky William Adams a Resident of the
said County ~~set~~ of Henry Ky, aged Eighty four
years next Christmas who being first duly
sworn according to law doth set his oath
the following Declaration in Order to
show the benefit of the provision made
by the act of Congress passed Jan 3d
1832, That he has heretofore been on the
Pension Roll for about Two years
and was taken off from the same
in consequence of leaving mon property
there, was impossible under the act of
Congress of the 18th March 1818, and
he states that his Certificate was given
to his Board as an apology why he
does not accompany this Declaration
He was a private soldier in the Revolution
under Captain Marion who died and was
buried by Capt Moore, who went from
the State of Pennsylvania to that in
Henry County Kentucky when applied
for his Pension on the aforesaid occasion, that
he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a
Pension as an army except the present
And he declares that his money is not on the

Pension Roll of any agency of any other State

Henry County Augt. (Term) 1832

On this 6th day of August 1832 Came here
into Court (being at Court of record) William Adams
and produced his declaration for a pension under
the Act of Congress of 1832 to which he was
sworn, and the Court hereby declare their opinion
after the investigation of the matter and putting the
interrogatories prescribed by the War Department
that the above named ~~former~~ applicant was a
revolutionary Soldier & served as he states.

Dear Madam:

In compliance with your request, you are furnished herein the Revolutionary War record of William Adams, as found in papers on file in pension claim, S. 30317, based upon his service in that war.

William Adams enlisted in "York town" in York County, Pennsylvania, sometime in February, 1776, served as a private in Captains Watson's and Moore's Companies, Colonel St. Clair's 2nd Pennsylvania Regiment; he was on board the ~~battalions~~ on the lakes in Canada at the mouth of Three Rivers, at the time of the battle there, and was discharged in March, 1777 in Philadelphia.

He was allowed pension on his application executed August 12, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Henry County, Kentucky.

On August 5, 1832 he was still living in Henry County, Kentucky, and stated that he would be eighty-four years of age "next Christmas". It is not shown where he was born, nor are the names of his parents given.

One John Adams in 1818 of Kentucky stated that he knew the soldier, William Adams while in the service in the Revolutionary War, his relationship to the soldier not shown.

If you desire information in regard to the last

payment of pension, name and address of person paid,
and possibly the date of death of the pensioner,
William Adams, you should apply to The Comptroller
General, General Accounting Office, Records Division,
Washington, D. C., and cite the following data:
