Reference is made to your request for information in regard to Ben Hardin who served in the Revolutionary War from Virginia and Later lived in Kentucky where he died in 1839.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim[5.31100, based upon the military service of the only Benjamin Hardin who enlisted from Virginia and later lived in Kentucky that is found in the Revolutionary War records of this office. The name does not appear as Ben Hardin.

Benjamin Hardin enlisted in Hampshire County, Virginia, in 1776 or 1777 and served ten months as private in Captain Stephen Ashby's company in Colonel Neville's Virginia regiment and was in McIntosh's Campaign. He afterwards served about two months in Captain Ashby's Virginia company and was in the siege of Yorktown.

He was allowed pension on his application executed Angust 19. 1818, at which time he was sixty-five years of age and was living in Franklin County, Kentucky.

In 1820 Benjamin Hardin stated that he had then living in his family six persons besides himself, namely: Rebeccah Hardin aged forty-three. William Jackson aged seventeen years, John Jackson aged thirteen years, Samuel Jackson aged eleven years, R. Ann Hardin aged five years, and ". Hardin aged three years.

In 1823 the soldier was living in Henry County, Kentucky, and stated that he had then only three children living with him, Esmely: Beckey Ann aged seven, Washington aged five, and Hancy aged two years.

In 1826 Benjamin Hardin referred to his brother, Ennis Hardin.

In 1827 the coldier referred to the following children: Mark, William, Daniel, Henry, Mathemiel, George Washington, and Mancy; he also referred to Jacob Kelly who married his daughter, Elizabeth.

The soldier stated in January, 1828, that his wife (name not given) had been dead six years last February, and he referred to George Hardin and Enon Hardin, relationship not shown.

In 1831 Benjamin Hardin was living in Henry County, Kentucky.

In 1832 one Ernest Hardin and one James Hardin were living but their relation to the soldier was not shown.

There are no further data relative to the soldier's family.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension of Benjamin Hardin, the name and address of the person to whom it was paid and possibly the date of death of this soldier, it is suggested that you address The Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D.C., giving the following data: Benjamin Hardin, Certificate #558, issued September 25, 1832, rate \$40 per annum, commenced March 4, 1831, Act of June 7, 1832, Kentucky Agency.
