Notes for HUGH J. BRONAUGH:

DR. HUGH JAMES BRONAUGH Age 77, of Atlanta died February 12, 2002 after a nine year battle with prostate cancer. A veteran of World War II, he flew in a B-24 as a bombardier in the Eighth Air force, 2nd Air Division with 489th Bomb Group stationed in Halesworth, England, and was awarded the distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters. After the war he earned his Ph.D. from the University of New Mexico and worked as a research chemist for 15 years. He came to GA State College as an associate professor in chemistry in 1963 and retired from GA State University in 1988 after teaching for 25 years. He enjoyed wood working, sailing, and annual reunions with his fight crew. He helped establish the Mighty Eighth Air Force Museum in Savannah. Dr. Bronaugh is survived by his wife, Suzie Bronaugh; daughters, Kathy Bronaugh and her husband Jim Plunkett of Lilburn, Jean Wright and her husband Stuart of Atlanta; son, Jim Bronaugh and his wife Shelley of Lawrenceville; sister, Ann Kathryn Green of Brownsville, IN; and grandchildren, Kathryn Wright, Mallory Bronaugh, Emily Bronaugh and Meg Bronaugh. Funeral services will be held Friday, 1:00 p.m. at St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church, Dr. James D. Curtis, officiating. Graveside

services will follow at 2:45 p.m. at Arlington Memorial Park, Dr. Jim Johnson officiating. Dr. Jim Bronaugh was beloved by his Georgia State University students, admired for his woodworking craftsmanship and decorated for his service as a bombardier in World War II.

Before he earned his doctorate in chemistry, he joined the 8th Army Air Force in 1943 and earned the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters. Half the casualties suffered by the Army Air Force occurred in the 8th, which had 47,000 men killed or wounded.

When the Mighty 8th established its popular museum at Pooler near Savannah, he helped raise money for special projects, said his son, Jim Bronaugh of Lawrenceville.

"He wanted to be a pilot, but he was not tall enough to reach the pedals in a B-24 bomber," said Dan Witt of Blairsville, a GSU colleague.

Dr. Bronaugh continued to attend reunions of the 8th and stayed in touch with his 10-man crew, said his son.

The funeral for Hugh James Bronaugh, 77, of Atlanta, who died of prostate cancer Tuesday at DeKalb Medical Center, is 1 p.m. today at St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church. A.S. Turner & Sons is in charge of arrangements.

Dr. Bronaugh was a research chemist in the private sector when he decided to become a college professor at 40, said his daughter Kathy Bronaugh of Lilburn.

"The students just worshipped him," said Mr. Witt, a retired physics professor.

"He was an excellent classroom teacher. He was one of the kindest, gentlest men I've ever known. He was exceptional."

He joined the GSU faculty in 1963 and retired in 1988. Outside the classroom, he was a competitive sailor and an accomplished woodworker.

"He did the fine work, and I did the big work" on their joint projects, said Mr. Witt. The most admired piece they designed and built was a computer desk for a fellow professor.

"It was all cherry with brass screws," Mr. Witt said.

"Even the inner parts you couldn't see were cherry."

Another woodworking partner, Jean Lawrence of Marietta, said: "He was really meticulous. When he built something, it was beautiful."

Dr. Bronaugh sailed his wooden boat, named Panic, in competitions at the Privateer Yacht Club in Chattanooga, said his daughter.

Other survivors include his wife, Suzie Bronaugh; another daughter, Jean Wright of Atlanta; a sister, Ann Kathryn Green of Brownsville, Ind.; and four grandchildren.
