I Martin W Boggis of the County of Muhlenberg & State of Kentucky being fable in body but of sound mind & disposing memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death and wishing to dispose of what estate God has given me pleased to bless me with, so as to give my legal Heirs & representatives little inconvenience after my decease do make after & publish this my last will & testament in the manner following

Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will & desire that after my decease my funeral expenses & just debts be paid

Item 2<sup>d</sup> It is my will & desire that my wife Martha E Boggis have the homestead tract of land entirely to her use & enjoyment during her widowhood the tract containing by Survey One hundred & ten acres after she claim to be my widow either by death or marriage then to be sold & the proceeds equally divided between her legal Heirs & representatives also what personal property as is equal by law exemption to house keepers

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give & bequeath to my son William Henry Boggis Two dollars to be paid out of my personal estate which shall constitute his entire interest in my estate

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my son James Marion Boggis the remaining fifty acres of my tract of land or what remains after taking off the One Hundred & ten acres as above specified which is to constitute his entire interest in my estate the north & bounds of the fifty acres hereby bequeathed to James Marion Boggis are as follows to wit Beginning at my Beginning Corn post & Red Oak thence running south with the east line to the south East corner of his enclosed field, thence west to the cross fence thence north with the S<sup>th</sup> Crop fence to the hanging Rock thence with the running west to include the number of acres to the north line thence to the beginning
