


My Brief In the Name of God amen I William
Rice being a citizen of Estuhlenberg county & state
of Kentucky being in good health of sound mind
& memory but have advanced in age & know well
that this appointed unto all others once to die
do hereby make ordain & appoint this my
last Will & Testament in manner & form
following that is to say First this my
will & desire that my true & loving wife

Frances have my land & the plantation whereon
 I now live with all the appurtenances of the same there
 unto belonging during her natural life, but
 immediately after her death the land & plantation as
 above described shall be possessed & enjoyed by my son
 Matthew Rice & his heirs forever together with one
 calf two ewes lambs ten geese and fowls a few hens with one
 bed & furniture which lie now has in possession Item the 2^d
 And where as I have given to my three sons Larkin
 Ezekiel & William each one tract of land lying in
 the County of Washington by & tis my will desire that
 should there ever be any money collected from the estate
 of James Vaughn Deed late of Virginia against this
 estate I have just claims that the same be equally divided
 between my four sons & two daughters Elizabeth Claiborne
 Rice & her husband James Rice Benjamin Rice Polly
 Rice & Anna Rice Item 3^d As I have empowered
 my son John Rice to go to Virginia to settle & transact
 my necessary business there this my Will & desire that his
 god that after receiving a reasonable compensation for
 his services & necessary expenses out of the proceeds of
 what he shall get from Virginia that my son Benjamin
 have one hundred dollars out of which I may yet from
 the Estate of my father & brother John Rice for his
 trouble & expences for putting that business in such train
 as it now stands in after which the residue or balance
 of what I may yet from Virginia shall be equally divided
 among all my children that shall then be living
 Item 4^e As my Will & desire that all the negroes
 that I now possess or may hereafter possess to gether
 with all my personal estate except what I have given
 to my son Matthew be possessed by my executors
 Mrs Frances for her most benefit for and during
 her natural life Item 5^f As the negroes that may
 be living after the death of my wife cannot be equally
 divided without selling them, as my will and
 desire that they be sold to the highest bidder, only


only amongst the children) & not out of the family
and the money thence arising to be equally divided
among all my children that may then be living.
Item 6th, Provided there should be nothing gotten from
Virginia or not enough to make one hundred & twenty
dollars to each of my under named children that is to
say Clabourn Rice, Jessie Rice, James Rice, Benjamin
Rice, Polly Rice & Penny Rice in that case the money
arising from the sale of the negroes shall be applied
to make up that sum to each of any children named
in the said Item, the balance then remaining
if any shall be equally divided among all my children
that shall be then living, Lastly I do hereby constitute
I appoint my two sons Clabourn Rice & James Rice
the only sole Executors of this my last Will and
Testament utterly revoking annulling & making void
all other Wills legacies & bequests by me before now
named or mentioned Ratifying & confirming this
and another to be my last Will & Testament IN
WITNESS whereof I have here unto set my hand
and seal this 4th day of November one thousand eight
hundred & seventeen
