March 23rd 1848

Being in proper mind and knowing the uncertainty of life I think it Right to make this my last Will and Testament - In the first place I recommend my soul in to the hands of God - Secondly that all my just debts to be paid Thirdly I will and bequith to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my land and all my property of every kind even all that I posses, to have and to hold while she remains a widow in my name, and my 2 sons I wish to stay with her as long as they becom of age, then if they can agree, then all that they make over what will dependly and Comfortably support her they shall have, and after her death or second Maridg I want my land and property to be equal divided between my 2 sons John B. Nottsinger and William Greene Nottsinger -
