I Jacob Wells of the County of Nucklinburg
and State of Kentucky knowing the uncertainty
of life and being of sound mind and memory
for which I thank God do make this my last
will and Testament as follows (to wit) I will and
declare that after my death my property of
every description be sold to the highest bidder
on a credit of Twelve months and the proceeds
of said sale after collected and all my just
debts paid to be divided as follows (to wit) I wish
my grand son Joseph J. Wells to have one
hundred and fifty dollars and my grand
son Jacob, St. Row Ten dollars and the balance
I wish equally divided between my seven
sons Frederick, William, John, James, ~~Joseph~~ David
and Miriel. taking into the account twenty
dollars already received by my son Frederick
and one hundred and fifty dollars heretofore
received by my son Miriel and thirty
dollars heretofore received by my son James
I appoint my sons James, Miriel and Miriel
Wells my executors to carry into effect
this my last will and Testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my name
and affixed my seal February 25th 1852

in our presence
