

Robert Mackriff of Bucklin  
Knox County Kentucky being of sound mind and ~~disposing~~  
of reasonable health, but calling to mind the uncertainty of  
human life and wishing to provide the uncertainty of  
disposal of the property with which God has blessed me to  
make and ordain this as my last will and testament hereby  
revoking and disannulling all and every other will or wills  
heretofore made by me back declaring this writing to be my  
last will & testament

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mrs.  
Mackriff during the time of her natural life all my pro-  
perty of every kind & description character real, personal and  
mixed to have and to use the same during her life

Item 2. I will and direct that after the death of my wife  
that all my property (Negroes excepted) be sold including my  
land the proceeds to be applied as hereinafter directed -

Item 3. I wish to provide for the comfort and happiness  
of my slaves and bequeath the money arising from the sale  
of my other property as mentioned in Item 2d applied for  
their benefit, I wish to Colonize them should the newly establis-  
hed Republic of Liberia constitute to flourish, I desire that  
they may be removed to that Country & the money raised  
from sale of property as before directed applied to their  
outfit & settlement in that Country, I hereby will & direct  
that at the death of myself & wife all the slaves now  
owned by me and their increase shall be free and enjoy  
all the rights and privileges of free persons, Not believing that  
they can do this but imperfectly in Kentucky wish them re-  
moved to some Country where they will be more advantag-  
eously situated & for the purpose of providing for this, and for  
their comfortable establishment, do will and bequeath to them  
the proceeds of all my other property remaining after the death  
of myself & wife for the purposes aforesaid

Item 4 As it likely that some important changes will  
be made in the organic law of our State by which

Blgros Cannot be emancipated and remain in the State  
 I hereby vest my executors with full & complete power to make  
 such arrangements in regard to the future location of my  
 Slaves as may to their seems best all Circumstances Considered  
 vesting them with power to send them to Liberia or Colonize  
 them in some other State as may be deemed most for their  
 interest retaining such control over said Slaves as may  
 be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Section  
 Item 5

I hereby make and appoint my Friends Joseph Revo  
 and Edward R. Weir my Executors to carry out the provisions  
 of this will In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
 my hand and seal this the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1850.
