Calvert all the property of whatever kind, real, personal and mixed that I may own at the time of my death to be hers, absolutely, in fee simple, with full power to sell, convey, exchange, mortgage, and to use and deal with as she may desire.

Third; I hereby nominate and elect my said wife, Ruth L. Calvert, to be the executrix of this my last will and testament, and ask that the Court having proper jurisdiction, to appoint her and that she be allowed to act without bond.
