I know all men by these presents, That I, Charles B. Summers, Sr., being of a sound and disposing mind do hereby publish and proclaim this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all wills heretofore made by me.

First, I nominate and appoint my Sons, Clarence N. Summers and John R. Summers executors without bond.

Second, I direct all just Claims and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable.

Third, I bequeath all my property, both personal and real, to my beloved and faithful wife, Mattie Summers, to be used and enjoyed by her during her life time, I direct and empower my executors to sell any and all property, if it should become necessary, for her support and maintenance so long as she lives, upon the death of my wife, Mattie Summers, the residue of my estate, should any remain, shall be divided as follows:

I give to my Sons, Clarence N. Summers and Tom C. Summers my farm and all live stock thereon which belongs to me, providing they pay my estate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in lawful money of the United States, said sum to be used in paying legacy hereinafter mentioned to the heirs of my now deceased son, Charles B. Summers, Jr.

I bequeath to my grandchildren, Clarence Morton Summers and Fannie May Summers the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars each, should either of the aforesaid grandchildren be dead at the time of the division of my estate, then the remaining grandchild shall receive the Five Hundred Dollars.

I give to my daughter, Mrs. W. O. Bauland, and to my son, John R. Summers, balance due on a Note of One Thousand Dollars now held by me and signed by John R. Summers maker, should either or both of the aforesaid be dead at the time of the division of my estate, then their next heirs shall inherit their part.
