Mind and disposing Memory the best I feel it my duty
to set all things right and proper as regards my personal
estate and money and not having any bodily heirs and
being unmarried I bequeath to my brother Benjamin O
Welch One dollar and to my brother Samuel Welch the re
mainder portion of three notes that I hold after taken out a
sufficiency to pay for toom stones to my grave One note of
fifty four Dollars and One to the Amount of Ten Dollars and
One of Twelve Dollars and also about Seven Dollars in money
I also give and bequeath that my beloved Sister Elizabeth
Leeway have One bed and bedstead and to my be
loved Mother Sary Welch two bed quilts and to my Sister
Catharine Shann and Sister-in-law Mary A Welch One bed
and the remainder portion of bed clothes to be divided be
tween them and after my debts and burrial expenses is paid
I lastly bequeath to my Brother William Welch the remain
portion of the three Hundred Dollars that may be on hand
at my decease that was to be paid to me by the said William
Welch a Order to wit of my Father Jesse Welch

affixed my seal this 18 day of October 1870
