ORIGINAL CLAIM.

Declaration, in order to be placed on the Pension List, under the Act of the 18th March, 1818.

County of *Scott* ss.

On this *2nd* day of *June* 1828, personally appeared in open court, (a) [being a court of record (b) *for the district, circuit, county, or corporation, as the case may be,* *John alias Edward O. Kennedy*]

John Kennedy - resident in said county, aged *65* years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of Congress of the 18th March, 1818, and the 1st of May, 1820; that he the said *Kennedy* enlisted (c) for the term of *3 years* on the *17th* day of *June* in the year *1777* in the State of *Pennsylvania* in the company (d) commanded by captain *or Lt. David Archibald* in the regiment commanded by colonel *Vernon*

in the line of the State of *Pennsylvania* on the continental establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps (or vessel) until *the close of the war* when he was discharged from the service in *Shelby County*

in the State of *Pennsylvania*; that he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension, except the present; that his name is not on the roll of any State, except *Pennsylvania*; and that the following are the reasons for not making earlier application for a pension: (e) *That he felt a heavy*

in not making earlier application & wished not to be a charge to the govt. & further that he had pay some time & he calculated he would get that & increased age & disability & being poor has hindered him to apply.

And, in pursuance of the act of the 1st May, 1820, I do solemnly swear, (or affirm, as the case may be,) that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March, 1818, and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. (f) *That, since the 18th of March, 1818,*

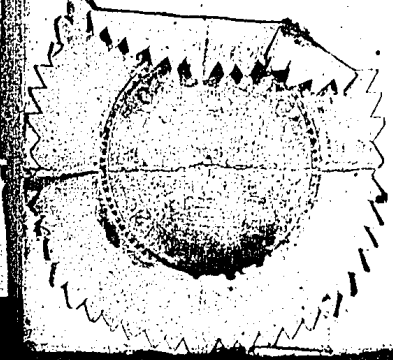

Suborn to, and declared, on the *second* day of *June* 1828 before (h) *the Judge of the Scott Circuit Court in open court* *Thomas M. Peck*

I *Black and* Clerk of the *Scott Circuit Court* do hereby certify, that it appears, to the satisfaction of the Court, that the said *John alias Edward O. Kennedy* did serve in the Revolutionary War, as stated in the preceding declaration, against the common enemy, for the term of nine months, under one engagement, on the continental establishment. I also certify, that the foregoing oath, (or affirmation,) and the schedule thereto annexed, are truly copied from the records of the said Court; and I do further certify, that it is the opinion of the said Court, that the total amount in value of the property exhibited in the aforesaid schedule is *seventy two* dollars and - cents.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed the seal of the said Court, on this *second* day of *June* 1828

 aged & feels his infirmity & is not very

 very weakly & ought not to labor at all -
 His daughter Pamela who lives with him but
 of age & manages for herself - & Jack aged
 17 years, Dunlap aged 15 years, M^m aged 12
 years & Richard about 9 years old -
 And they would not get along without
 the assistance of ^{the applicant} ~~him~~, instead of there affording him any
 assistance -

* There have been no changes in my
 property since the 18th March 1818 except
 what has been converted into family
 use. That he was poor then and
 remains so yet.

I have made no change in my property except for
 family use - say about forty dollars worth of beef
 for the years 1822 & 1823 in depreciated bank paper -
 I have used about ^{three} head of small cattle every year
 since 18th March 1818 for family use - I sold pork to amount
 of \$25. for the year 1824 to assist paying my debts -
 I have had to buy bacon every year for the support
 of my family out of my crop since that time
