JAMES MASON a citizen of this county and a soldier in the Revolution appeared in court and produced a schedule of his property amounting to \$0.75 and having sworn that it was true to be recorded, which follows in these words To wit:

Schedule

District of Kentucky Owen County Ss.

On this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1822 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of record (so made by the laws of Kentucky and having the power of fine and imprisonment) for said County James Mason aged 95 years resident in Owen County aforesaid being just duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he lived in the Revolutionary War as follows, that he enlisted in the year 1777 in Captain Fleming's company in Colonel Heath's Regiment being the Fourth Virginia in which he served three years he was in the Battle of Brandywine and was afterwards that he was regularly discharged from said Regiment, that he is attested and did not obtain his discharge in writing that he some after his discharge enlisted again in the second Regiment of Yorkers in the year in Captain James Gress's company in Colonel Peter Henshaw's Regiment in which he served three years and obtained a regular discharge therefrom, that he again enlisted at Albany New York in the train of Artillery, Captain Andrew Monro's company in Colonel Lums's Regiment from which at the close of the War he was regularly discharged. And I do solemnly swear that I am a resident citizen of United States on 11<sup>th</sup> of

March 1818. and that I have not since that time  
by gift, sale or in any other manner disposed of  
my property or any part thereof either intent wholly  
to diminish it or to bring myself within the  
provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act  
to provide for certain services engaged in the land  
and naval service of the United States in the Rev-  
olutionary War passed 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818  
and that I have not nor has any person in  
trust for me any property or securities contracts  
or debts due to me nor have I any income other  
than what is contained in the bequeathed be-  
quested and by me received

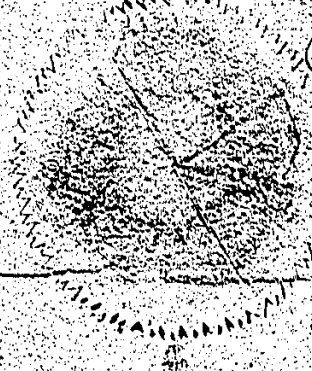
