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I Ruben Lancaster of the County of Scott
and State of Kentucky. do hereby certify that
some time in the year 1808. I became acquaint-
-ed with John Thomas Esq. in the Harrison
County Kentucky, and that I have been acqu-
-ainted with him down to the present time
and that from a Circumstance of my having
a brother who took sick in the army of the
army of the United States & returned home
and died & Mr. John Thomas & I have
frequently been in conversation about my bro-
-ther with whom J. Thomas became acquainted
- ^{as he informed me} much in the army after which conversation has
- induced me to believe him to be a soldier of
the revolution, & that he has generally as far as
I can have any knowledge whilst J. Thomas &
me lived neighbors together in the County of
Harrison State after been reported to have been
a soldier of the revolution ~~from~~ ^{his}
March 25th 1833 —

The affidavit of Cornelius Duwall a clergyman residing in Owen County Ky. Taken in Owen County on the 11th day of July 1834 who being duly sworn according to law upon his oath states that he was well acquainted with John Thomas of Owen County Ky. who departed this life on the day of June 1833 and whose widow Sarah Thomas still surviving and is as he is informed making an application to the War Department for an allowance on account of the revolutionary services of her said husband. This affiant states that the said John Thomas was a man of good character and had the reputation of having been a soldier of the revolution and this affiant never heard the fact disputed or doubted and is of the opinion that he was one. This affiant states that he is well acquainted with Sarah Thomas above named and that she is a woman of fine standing and of undoubted veracity sworn to and subscribed the day & year aforesaid.

Be it known that on the 11th day of August 1833 personally appeared before me ^{Wm. H. Brown} a Justice of the peace in and for said County Thomas Madox and relict of John Thomas deceased who being first duly sworn according to law did on his oath make the following statement viz

That she is a resident of the said County of Owen in the State of Kentucky and is now 53 years of age - that her deceased husband John Thomas was a resident of Owen County Kentucky at the time of his death which event took place on the 27th day of June last past that at the time of his death he was 71 years of age - She states that her said husband was a soldier of the revolution and lived during that war in Orange County Virginia - that as she has been informed by him and others and very believing he entered the service of the United States about the year 1778 upon a tour of twelve months in the company of Capt Garland Burley and was attached to the regiment commanded by Col Richard Bopler whether this service was under an enlistment or as a volunteer or under draft she cannot say

She also further states that according to her information as received from her said husband & others he afterward entered the service as a drafted militia man in the company of Capt Benjamin Johnson of Orange County Va and served therein for three months that being the length of his engagement

She also states that afterward as she is informed by what she has heard her said husband say together with others he ~~afterward~~ again entered the service as a drafted militia man for a tour of three months and served accordingly in the company of Benjamin Johnson the same man who was his capt ~~was~~ the preceding tour -

She further states that the whole of his services as above named were rendered during the revolutionary war and that they amount in the aggregate to the eighteen months service the whole of which she truly believes was performed by her said dec^d husband as a private soldier and that during his lifetime he never received a pension from the Government nor is his name on the pension roll of any State - She states that she claims as his widow the amount of pension which would have been due him up to the time of his death under the act of June 7th 1832.

day of December 1834 who being duly sworn according to law
doth upon his oath make the following statement - that is to wit
that she resides in Owen County dec 2nd at the house of Richard
Vallanougham and is now 13 years of age - she states that
she is the sister of John Thomas who died in Owen County
on the 27th day of June 1833 and whose widow Sarah
Thomas now lives in the said County and is about making
an application to the War Department of the United States
for an allowance on account of the Revolutionary services of
the said John Thomas - She further states that the said John
Thomas at the time of his death was upward of 71 years
of age and that during the Revolutionary War he together
with this deponent resided with their father in Orange County
Virginia - She states that she was older than the said John
Thomas and she well remembers that he did serve some
- at least of duty during the Revolutionary War though she
has forgotten the names of his officers - and she has also
forgotten the number of times and their particular length
and the date precisely when he entered upon them but
she does know that during said War he did not serve
up than eighteen months and she is confident that said
service was performed between the beginning of the year
1778 and the taking of Coramatis in the fall of the year
1781 - She states that his widow the said Sarah Thomas
is very poor, infirm and dependant and the pittance due
to her from the government is much needed by her on account
of the service of her husband is much needed by her and this
deponent is convinced that he he served faithfully
