Queen County Set

On this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1833

Came in person in the County Court for said County  
before by and between John Blanton Jacob A  
Smith and James B. Sale Justices  
Composing the Court now sitting Henry Loom  
a resident of Queen County State of Kentucky  
aged 74 years of age who being first duly  
sworn according to law doth on this date  
make the following declaration in order to  
obtain the benefits of the acts of Congress  
passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832

That he entered the Service of the United  
States and served under the following officers,

That in the year 1779 whilst a  
resident of the State of Maryland this  
affiant Volunteered as a private in the  
army of the revolution for three months  
and served in Captain Hugh Forest's Company  
which the name of the Col not recollects, because  
of old age and infirmity, that he faithfully  
served out his term of three months and  
was from the Service discharged but  
has lost the same,

That in one month after the expiration  
of the aforesaid three months tour of duty,  
this affiant Volunteered for an other tour  
of three months and served in Hugh  
Forest's Company - the Col's name not

recollects owing to old age & infirmity, that he was in this tour of duty in some skirmishes and engagements, that he faithfully served out this tour of duty and was therefrom discharged.

That in one month after the afore said tour was performed, this affiant again went into the service for three months as a Volunteer, and served in the afore said Company of Hugh Forests Company and was from said service after having faithfully served out his tour of three months discharged, which he has lost or mislaid.

He states that he was born in 1752 to his last recollection, and in the State of Maryland, that when called into the service he lived in the State of Maryland, since the revolution and now I live in the State of Kentucky Owen City, That I have no record of my age, That for all the tours of duty I performed I was Volunteered. I state the names of some of the regular officers, I recollect no officers except my captain, I state that from extreme old age & infirmity I cannot even recollect my ~~own~~ Col's name, I received discharges for all the but have lost them,

by the war department, that Henry Toon  
the above named applicant served as  
he states, and that John Holbrooks &  
Moses Allsman Citizens of Owen County Ky  
are reputable men, and that their  
statements are entitled to credit. The Court  
further certifies that a preacher could not  
be obtained to certify for the applicant.
