On the 10th day of August 1839 personally appeared before me John Frythe a Justice of the Peace for the County of Pendleton Henry Collins resident in S^c County aged seventy years who being first duly sworn. According to Law, took and his Oath (made the following declaration in Oath to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed June the 7th 1832; that he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1779 (as well as he recollects) for three years with Capt. Wallace and served in the 1st & 2nd Regiments of the Virginia line under the following named Officers, that he enlisted as above stated under Capt. Wallace in the County of Calhoun & State of Virginia and was attached to the 1st Regiment Commanded by Colo. John Campbell in the line of the State of Virginia on Continental Establishment that he continued to serve in S^c Corps under different Officers, the Capt. & the Colonel both having been killed the former at the battle of Gilynd Court house, and the latter at the Eutaw Springs Capt. Wallace was succeeded by Capt. Anderson & Colo. Campbell by Colo. Hays, who commanded the regiment when he was discharged from the service in the State of North Carolina, that he was in the battle of Gilynd Court house, Eutaw Springs, Camden & besides several other skirmishes; from the great length of time it would be impossible for him to recollect the different Counties & Districts of Country he marched through ^{Virginia} it is to say that he enlisted in Calhoun County Virginia as above set forth & marched from thence through the southern Counties of Virginia to North Carolina and to South Carolina.

He hereby relinquishes every Claim whatever to a Pension or any Gratuity except the present, and he

declares that his name is not on the petition or of
any agency in any state (or of any) only on that
of the agency of the state of Virginia — He
further declares he is unable to attend court, owing
to bodily infirmity. Having been bed ridden for ten

declarant Henry Colson resides do hereby certify that
the person named Henry Colson is from a disease called
the Rheumatism with which he has been affected for
ten years, he is unable to attend the Court in which
I am a Justice or Member; Having been ~~bed ridden~~
for ten years, and I do not think from present app-
earances that he ever will be able to attend the County
Court or any other earthly Tribunal of Justice in
this world. I have therefore in pursuance of an Act
of Congress of the 7th of June 1832 attended at his
place of Residence and Administered the foregoing
Oath before Me on this 10th day of August
1832, and I the s^d John Forsythe Justice of the
peace as aforesaid do hereby declare my opinion that
the above named applicant was a non-resident
at the time and so as he states, Given under my hand
this 10th day of August 1832.
