State of Kentucky June 15
Pendleton County

On this 15th day of June 1818 before the
Board of County Court of Pendleton County, personally
appeared Charles Love aged 65 years resident in Pendleton
County and State of Kentucky being first duly
sworn according to law doth own his oath make
the following Declaration in order to obtain the
pardon of made by an act of Congress entitling
an act to provide for certain persons engaged
in the land and naval Service of the United
States in the revolutionary War —

That he the said Charles Love entered the Service
of the United States as a Substitute in the room
of Brian Smallwood in Capt. Thomas Berry's
Company of the 8th Virginia Regiment commanded
by Col. Moreman and in Capt. Charles
Scott's Brigade he entered the Service
in March in the year of 1777 at Philadelphia and was
discharged at Valley Forge on the 5th day of
March 1778 and was in the battle of Germantown and at
his Reduced Circumstances needs the assistance
of his Country for support

Dear Sir:

As requested by Mr. H. W. Jencks of this city,
you are furnished herein the record of Charles Love,
as found in papers on file in pension claim, S. 38048,
based upon his service in the War of the Revolution.

The date and place of birth of Charles Love
were not shown, nor were the names of his parents
stated.

Charles Love enlisted in Philadelphia, sometime
in March, 1777, and served as a private in Captain
Thomas Berry's company in Colonel Bowman's Eighth
Virginia regiment; he was in the battles of Brandywine
and Germantown, and was discharged March 5, 1778 at
Valley Forge.

He was allowed pension on his application ex-
ecuted June 15, 1818, at which time he was sixty-five
years of age, and a resident of Pendleton County,
Kentucky.

The papers on file in this claim contain no
reference to the family of Charles Love.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of
pension, name and address of the person paid, and
possibly the date of death of this pensioner, you

should apply to The Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D. C., and furnish the following data:-
