On this 15 day of June 1848 before the Court  
of Pindilton County and State of <sup>the</sup> appeared  
Bennett Williams aged <sup>40</sup> years Resident of  
Pindilton County and State of <sup>the</sup> who being  
first duly sworn according to law doth on  
his Oath make the following declaration  
in order to obtain the process made by

States in the revolutionary War

That he the said Bennett Williams was  
included in the Service of the United States in  
Pindilton County Virginia in the year to the  
best of his Recollection of 1778 when the  
year before Charlestown was taken for the term  
of eighteen months under ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> command of  
at Dinwiddie and marched to Alexandria  
under the command of Genl. Markes who com-  
manded the Company on a March to Petersburg  
at that place was attached to a Regiment com-  
manded by Col. Buford and Col. Howes of the  
Virginia line on the Continental Establishment  
and marched from there to <sup>near</sup> Morris's Corner  
in South Carolina about the time that  
Charlestown was taken and then was un-

on a water called black water or long river  
and after being about 14 months in the  
service was made a prisoner near the  
line of North & South Carolina near a  
place called the Hanging Rocks by  
Col. Parson and was paroled and  
he states he delivered his parole to either  
Col. Haves or Capt. Markis and that  
he never applied for any discharge the  
time of service expiring soon after he never  
heard of being exchanged - and that  
he is in reduced circumstances and  
needs the assistance of his country for support

On this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February 1830 personally appeared in open court being a court of Record for the District and County of Grant B. Williams resident in said County aged sixty six years who being first duly sworn according to Law with an his oath make the following declaration in order to claim the provisions made by the acts of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1820, that he the said B. Williams entered for the term of 18 months on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ in the year \_\_\_\_\_ in the State of Virginia in the Company commanded by Captain Howard in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Buford in the Line of the State of Virginia in the \_\_\_\_\_ ~~Establishment~~ establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps until the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1780 when he was discharged from the service in the war which settle him in the State of South Carolina, that he hereby relinquishes every claim whatsoever to a pension except the present; that his name has been placed on the pension list, that the Number of his pension Certificate is \_\_\_\_\_ and that he now before exhibits a Schedule of his property because it was not until recently his property has become so reduced, nor his infirmities so great as at present. And in pursuance of the act of the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1820, I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not

since that time by gift sale or in any manner  
 disposed of my property or any part thereof with  
 intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself  
 within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled  
 an act to provide for certain persons engaged in  
 the land and Naval service of the United States  
 in the Revolution was passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
 March 1818, and that I have not, nor has any  
 person in Trust for me any property or securities  
 contracts or debts due to me: nor have I any  
 income other than what is contained in the Sched-  
 =ule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. That  
 since the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 the following chan-  
 =ges have been made in my property: 60 Acres of  
 Land was sold by virtue of an Execution which  
 emanated from the Clerk's Office of the Grant Cir-  
 =cuit Court, to George Williams on the ... day of

1829 by the sheriff of the said County to sat-  
 =isfy and pay a Judgment obtained against me  
 in said court by Martin Draper for Money bor-  
 =rowed of him: amount for which it is said \$104.00  
 One horse sold to Geo. Williams on the day  
 of 182 amount received - 3 25.00  
 Ditto, one to Charles Wright on the day  
 of 182 amount received in Cash - 30.00  
 = amount of this paper \$60. equal to \$30. in specy  
 sold to persons not recalled 4 or 5 hundred  
 Cattle amount received, to the best of my  
 recollection - 25.00  
 Last by death something like 16 or 18 head  
 of sheep - sold one lot to Martin Draper on  
 the day of 1829 - 5.00  
 \$189.00

This day personally appeared in open Court being a Court of record for the District and County of Grant Martin Draper who being first duly sworn deposes and swears that the sixty acres of land as sold by the Sheriff of said County on the 15 day of August 1829 and as purchased by George Williams and as set forth in the foregoing part of this certificate was sold to satisfy and pay a Judgment which I obtained against the said Williams at our Grant County Court on the day of May 1829 for money borrowed of me by the said Williams on the day of 1829 to satisfy and pay a note executed by himself & John Williams to the Executors of Perry Chipman ad. for \$200 = fifty as this amount has been told & believed was given by himself and the said John Williams at the sale of the said Chipmans property; he further states that he believes the property as purchased at said sale was applied to the exclusive use & benefit of the defendant so far as they was purchased for his benefit; and that he has known the said Williams for several years and believes him to be a sober industrious and worthy Citizen; and further this deponent swears that given under my hand this 8th day of February 1830
