The other info I recieved on them is that David probably md. (2nd) Sarah/Sally (possibly Noble)___; David was known to have lived in Perry & Clay as well as Breathitt Co.'s.

See Document Section for Marriage Bond of John Hollensworth, with David Turner as Bndsmn. David signs his own name and apparently can read & write well.

I firmly believe, as did A.B.Burns, that David is s/o "Old" Roger Turner, b. 1757.

When David & Sally Turner came to Ky., they settled in an area that came to be Perry Co., which later became Breathitt Co. In 1840, they were living on the Middle Fork of the Ky. River, around Lick Branch & Turner's Creek area. According to the deed, they were neighbors to James "Shifty" Turner & Thomas Herald, who md. Elizabeth "MaMa Betts" Turner. Both "Shifty" Jim & Thomas Herald are also my great & 2nd grt. Gr. Parent's./J.T.Burton.

I secured a Deed in Perry Co., Ky., Deed Bk. B, p.66, wherein Peter Hammons enters a fee for deed to DAVID TURNER. Thus: "This indenture made & entered into this 5th day of August, 1831, between Peter Hammons & Nancy Hammons, of the County of Perry and State of Ky., of the one part, and David Turner, of the said county and state aforesaid, of the other part. The said Peter & Nancy Hammons, for and in consideration of \$250.00 sell unto the said David Turner, a certain tract or parcel of land, containing 170 acres, more or less, situated in Perry Co. with boundary on a conditional line between James Turner ("Shifty Jim/ Hick") and Thomas Herald, on the back line of the land, thence to various courses and distances and beginning, running so as to include the Sugar Camp, lying on the LICK BRANCH, also all the improvements up to the hickory cord on the creek above said Hammon's. The deed is signed, sealed, and delivered in the presents of these witnesses: ROGER TURNER, THOMAS TURNER, & ALEXANDER HERALD. It was recorded by Jesse Combs, Clerk, on March 23, 1835. (I have even checked to see if Sarah may have been a Hammons, but have found no records.)

In the 1850 Cens. of Brthtt. Co., David Turner was House # 297, living with or next door to James "Shifty" Turner & Sarah Jane Mayes, and house # 297 is also listed as Samuel "Saul" Turner & Sarah Herald. Next to them in

house # 298, and with all 4 families living right together, was Roger Turner, Jr., b. 1826; md. Nancy Turner, b. 1834.

They are buried at Wm. Buck Herald Cemty.
 - 3. Roger Turner, Jr., b. 1826 (aged 24 yr. In 1850 Cens.); d. bet. 1865-69; md. Nancy Turner, d/o Samuel "Saul" Turner & Sarah Herrald.

 Jesse & Sarah lived in Wilkes Co. & Buncombe Co., N.C. Their son, James "Shifty" Turner shows his place of birth as Buncom Co., N.C. on his death record in Brthtt. Co. dated Dec. 20, 1858.

- Item 1: I refer you to see: "Kentucky's Active Militia" by J. T. Cannon, (in collection at Ky. Historical Soc., Frankfort, Ky. Researched in early 1970's). The book lists Jesse Turner, date: Aug. 10, 1787, for his Service against the Shawnee Indians. The book lists: 1) David Noble, 9/11/1788, for 17 days of Service; 2) Jesse Turner, 8/10/1787, Service as a Soldier against the Shawnee Indians.*
- ** It appears that Jesse couldn't have been more than 16 or 17 yr. old at the time, making him b. c. 1770.
- Item 2: The 1840 Census of Clay Co., Ky., where Samuel, Roger, etc. were all living at the time, gives his age as being between 60 & 70 yrs. old, making him again born between 1770 & 1780. He is not in the 1850 Census of Brthtt. Co., but I refer you to:
- Item 3.: 1880 Mortality Schedule of Jackson Co., Ky.: JESSE TURNER, aged 103 yrs., died Sept., 1879; parents born in No. Carolina, Jesse Turner born in So. Carolina. In Sept., 1879, he is aged 103 yrs., this will place his year of birth at 1776.
- We already know that in 1787, Jesse served against the Shawnee Indians. This earlier record will be more accurate, when memories have not faded so much. I place the year of birth at 1770.
- It has not been possible for me to establish the parents of Jesse Turner, Sr., at this time. Any help appreciated. I know he came into Ky., after being first in the Carolina's & then to Tenn., where Roger Turner, Jr. was born. If Jesse was b. 1770, he may be too old to be a son of Roger Turner, Sr., b. 1750-(1757), making Roger only about 13 yr. When Jesse was born. Jesse's oldest son is named John Turner and he has a son named Thomas "Wee Tom" Turner (who md. On 8/5/1829 to Alexellen Herrald). The English customarily named the first son after the husband's father, i.e. John Turner. So... I am still undecided as to parent's of Jesse Sr. Hopefully more research & information will shed firm light on this issue.
- Item 4: The 1840 Census of Breathitt Co. shows Thomas Turner, 1 male aged between 60 & 70 yr. old (b. bet. 1770-1780), and living with him was another male (Roger) aged between 90 & 100 yr. Old, (b. 1740-1750). So, Roger Turner or Thomas Turner could be Jesse's father.
- Item 5: The 1850 Brthtt. Cens. Shows Jesse Turner, b. c.1789, & wife, Cytha, b. 1794, with 7 CH. born between 1812 & 1838. This is not either of our Jesse Turner's.

1858; Murdered, Killed by Jesse Turner, born Buncombe Co., N. C.; married, white male, living on Middle Fork of Ky. River. See enclosed copy of Microfilm page. He md. Ca. 1832 to Sarah Jane "Jennie" Mayes, b. March, 1806; b. (1812 per 1850 Cens.), d. after 1900 Cens., a d/o old David Mayes & Mary ____. (I believe firmly David Turner, their son, is named after Sarah's father, David Mayes.)

James Turner was raising his family on the Middle Fork of the River. He & his sons & relatives had been engaged in logging for some time. J.Green Trimbel wrote an article for the Jackson Times some years ago, describing this way of life:

... "At the time Breathitt County was created the people relied principally on the transportation of coal and saw logs down the river as a means of making money. They built their own boats, which were from fifty to sixty feet long, and as there were no saw mills in the county they had to saw the planks by hand with rip saws and hew the gunnels and stachions with a broad-axe. A considerable income was derived from the sale of deer-skins, fur, honey, bees-wax, and ginseng, with all of which the county was bountifully supplied." 'Recollections of Breathitt', Jackson Times, by J. Green Trimbel.

On Dec. 20, 1858, 2nd. Grt. Gr. father, James Turner, was ... "Murdered." See copy of Brthtt. Co. Vital Stats, Reel 4, year 1858, from Publ. Library, Covington, Ky., which reads thus:

"James Turner White 53 yr. Old male Farmer married Dec. 20th (date of death in 1858) cause of death: Murdered, Killed by Jesse Turner. Place of birth was listed as Buncombe Co., N.C. (not Tenn.); Place of Death named as Middle Fork.

I have enclosed a copy of the microfilm page, as much controversy seems to surround James's death. For years it was told that his body was never recovered and was buried somewhere near where he was killed. However, it is clear that the clerk who recorded the death had knowledge of what occurred, or else would not have written it on the page. It seems there may have been a cover up of some kind, as no one ever seems to have been brought to justice for the murder, that we know about. We do know that in 1900 Census, Sarah Jane "Jenny" Turner is living with her son, Jesse "Shifty" Turner, who md. his cousin, Jemima Herald. See p. 111 for their CH. Jenny Turner died sometime after 1900 cens.

Item 1.: Jesse "Shifty" Turner was referred to in the deed of May 14, 1913 as Jesse Turner, Sr., and was the... 'party of the second part.' All others named were parties of the 'first part' and all were conveying land they had acquired "from their deceased father, James Turner, containing 100 acres, more or less."

Witnesseth: That said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Forty Dollars (40) cash paid in hand, Three Hundred Dollars to be paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowleged, we do hereby sell & convey to the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns four-fifths of the following described property, to wit:

A certain tract or parcel of land lying in Breathitt County, on and being same land inherited by first parties from their deceased father, James Turner, containing 100 acres, more or less.

Beginning at the mouth of the Canebrake; thence running up the point between the Canebrake to Pigeon Roost Fork to the dividing ridge between Turner's Creek and Lick Branch; thence running up said divide to the top of the point between the Pigeon Roost Fork and the Duff Fork; thence running down the point with Tolbert Turner's line to the beginning.

Th have and to hold the same, together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said party of the first parts hereby covenants with the said party of the second part, that they will warrant the title to the property hereby conveyed unto the said party of the second part and his heirs and assigns forever.

A lien is retained upon the property hereby conveyed as security for the payment of the said unpaid purchase money.

There came a big snow on the ground. So, Mose heated a board and ran out to feed the calf every day. He stood on the board to keep his feet from freezing off."

I don't have a lot of information on the Mays Family. All I know is that my 3rd. Great grandfather, James "Shifty" Turner md. Sarah Jane Mayes. There is some information that says she was a Bicknell. I can not rely on it, because all the old family members on Turner's Creek who really knew anthing about Sarah Jane, all said she was a Mays. Old Charlie Burton even said she was a daughter of Old David Mayes. I also know that Lillie Hall-Spicer said her great grandmother was a Mays as well. I know that some of the Mayses, married Bicknell's, and think this may be where some were confused. I firmly believe old Moses "Modie" Mays was brother to Sarah Jane. Sarah Mays & James Turner named a son, David, after I believe her father, David Mays. David Turner, in turn, had a son named Moses. These families were very closely connected and lived close as well. I have never known Sarah Jane to have been identified as any one other than a MAYS. If any of you have any further information on these families of Turner's Creek, I hope you will feel free to share it.

David May served in the Revolutionary War, as a Private for three months on the Virginia line. He entered the service in Halifax Town of Pittsylvania Co. Va. Under Capt. Wm. McDaniel, and Lt. Glen McDaniel. Thus:

Item 1: State of Kentucky, County of Perry:

On the 12th day of May, personally appeared in open court before this Justice of this County of Perry now sitting, David May, a resident of said County of Perry, aged 70 years., who being first duly sworn according to law, does onlis oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the Service of the United States as a Volunteer for three months in Halifax Town, Pittsylvania County, Va., under Capt. Wm. McDaniel & Lt. Clem McDaniel in the Spring before Gates defeat marched from there and crossed the Staunton River at Dick's Ferry; before they got to the ferry met other companies at different points Militia and Regular, crossed the Catawba River at the old Nation Ford, passed W. Lynch Tavern before got to Catawba River where we were also joined by some troops- passed Bush's River and on to the main Army under Genl. Gates (& perhaps Genl. Pinckney, as the name is recollected somewhere) about 8 or 10 miles from the battleground- and was in the Battle at Gate's defeat and was a guard of the baggage – the Army retreated and many were slain in the swamp. After they left the Battle – ground- returned afterward home and was discharged by Capt. Wm. McDaniel for three months.

(*It appears David May was quite a young soldier at the time).

Shortly afterward, he entered the service again for three months as a substitute for Thos. James, under Captain Spencer Shelton, Lt. Ebenezer Hall, & Ensign James ______. They met at Wilson's old mill in Pittsylvania Co., Va. The Commander of the Regiment not recollected, but the Major was Major Robert. Williams until he was either broke or resigned, then Major Alexander Rose, Genl. Green, he recollects- they stayed 2 weaks at Wilson's mill, then went on by Salisbury & Charlotte to the seige of 96. Recollects Col. Lee, Washington, & ______ - He was in the Battle at the Seige and in the ditch with many others when about 60 were killed & wounded. He himself was wounded in the thigh- He recollects a few days before the Seige had to retreat the county. Had gone to seige and a man passed them on a white horse and raised a flag; the gate was opened they went in & great rejoicing was heard- at the Retreat when we crossed Broad River a Line of Battle was formed expecting the enemy but they only came to the River& did not cross- In a few days he was taken with the Smallpox and was able to do no more service until at least a month after his term had expired- he got his discharge for three months but could not go home for 4 months.

He hereby relinquishes his every claim whatever to a pension or ______ except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. Sworn to & Subscribed this day & year aforesaid.

DAVID MAY (his own signature)

Daniel Duff, a Clergyman, residing in Perry Co., certified that he was well acquainted with David May believed him to be reputable and believed he was a soldier of the Revolution and that he was 70 yrs. Old.

8 Sept., 1834, Roger Turner & Edward Polly appeared in court and certified that the court, after investigation and interrogation by the War Department in the matter, certify that David May was a Revolutionary Soldier and served as he said he did and that they all believe he is entitled to credit.

Edward Polly swore under oath that he knew David May well in the Revolutionary War and served wit him a tour of three months under Capt. Spencer Shelton. He swore and subscribed to the testimony on 3rd. August, 1833.

Roger Turner, on the 10th day of August, 1834, personally appeared before the Justice of the Peace a made oath that he had been well acquainted with David May for 40 years long before he left North Carol and that he served in 2 campaigns one under Capt. Wm. McDaniel and one under Capt. Spencer Shelton and that he believed David May served as he stated.

Item 2: Deed: David Mays of Estill Co., Ky. Entered into an indenture on the 4th day of July, 1836 between John McKinley, attorney for John Wilson, deceased, of the City of Philedelphia, and Thomas Humphreys, executors, in behalf of his wife on one part, and David Mays, of the county of Estill, on the ot part. That the said parties for the sum of \$150.00 in hand, do acknowledge, grant, bargain, and sell to the s David Mays, a certain tract or parcel of land containing 316 acres, lying & being in Perry County on the No side of the Middle Fork of the Ky. River. The said David Mays & his heirs say they will defend the said tr of land against the claim of the said John Wilson. Deed signed by attorneys by J. McKinley & Thomas Humphreys. Witnesses: Hardin Combs, Andrew Couch & Thomas May.

The Hall's & Farmer's of Turner's Creek, Ky.

(Living in Harlan Co., Ky., prior to 1860)

My great, great, grand father, Stephen Farmer, was born on the New River, No. Car. He came first to Clinch River, Tenn. and then on to Harlan Co., Ky. Stephen's son, William

Farmer, was born on the Clinch River in 1796. Stephen settled on Martin's Fork, five miles from Mt. Pleasant in Harlan Co. Stephen's brother, Eli Farmer, settled in Pulaski Co., Ky. At about the same time.

Lewis Farmer kept a hotel. After Bell Co. was formed from Harlan Co., Lewis moved to Pineville, Ky., and ran a store there until he died. **David Farmer** went to Iowa. **James** Farmer lived and died in Harlan Co. He represented the County several times in the Legislature. James was born in 1800. **Betsy Farmer** married a Ledford and raised a family in Harlan Co. William Farmer lived on the Hopper farm on Red Bird.

My great grandfather, William Farmer, killed his first bear on Chestnut Flat in 1812, when he was 16 yr. Old. William heard a cracking of nuts and finally saw a bear cracking and eating walnuts. He stole upon it, took aim, and fired. He thought the bear was coming toward him and fled home to his father. He had stolen his father's gun out and slipped out to hunt. He told his father what he had done. They went to the scene and tracking the bear a few hundred yards, found him dead.

The Farmer's are German, not Dutch. My mother was a Frost, an Irish family. Her mother was a Robert's, kin to old Penny Roberts. She called him "Uncle."

Over the years, the information I have gathered has been from old family records, letters, older generation members, many of whom are deceased, as well as Census & court records. The family and oral traditions say that Stephen Farmer was son of John Farmer, Sr. The records also indicate there were three ot early Farmer's named: Joel, Elisha, and John Farmer, Jr. They are thought to be brother's of Stephen Farm Sr.

In the 1820 Census of Knox Co., Ky., Stephen Farmer, Sr. is aged 45 yrs. & up. In 1830 in Hawkins C Tenn., he is aged 50 - 60 years., with 1 Female aged 50 - 60 yrs. Stephen died abt. 1840 in Claiborne Co., Tenn.

**... "In the early days of Harlan, there were very brave and cunning hunters. The town of Cawood had been terrorized by a creature of slyness, who, when it let out its blood curdling shriek, terrorized everyone.

One evening, about dark, Carr Hall, and his brother Jim were on their way home when they encountered this creature up in a tree. One of them took a very large rock and threw it into the tree, hitting it right between the eyes and knocking it, stunned, from the tree. The other brother, who had armed himself with a club, clobbered it over the head. They strung it up and took it home to find it was a nine foot black panther."

Hezekiah was nicknamed "Center Carr" because of his good aim. He's my 2nd gr.grandfather, and father of Wm.McKinley "Mack" Hall, who later settled on Turner's Creek.
