before the subscriber a justice of the Peace for the said County
of Putnam, Personally appeared Julius Glazebrook, who on
his oath declares that he is the same person who formerly belong-
ed to the Companies Commanded by Captains Wallace
and Thomas Williams in the Regiment Commanded
by Colonel Worth Richardson and Tucker in the service
of the United States, that his name was placed on the pension
roll of the State of Kentucky from whence he has lately removed
that he now resides in the County of Putnam in the State of
Indiana where he intends to remain, and wishes his pension
to be there payable in future. The following are his reasons
for removing from Kentucky to Indiana (viz) His
great age and feeble health required that he should be
carefully treated, and he has a son residing in said
County of Putnam with whom he now resides, and where
he expects to reside so long as he lives his

Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of
the act of Congress passed June 18th 1832
State of Kentucky
County of Casey

On this tenth day of December 1832
personally appeared in open Court before
the worshipful Justices of the Casey County
Court now sitting Julius Glazedbrook a
Resident of Casey County State of Kentucky
aged eighty years the 15th day of April last
who being first sworn. According to Law
doth on his oath make the following
Declaration in order to obtain the benefit
of the act of Congress passed June 18th 1832
That he entered the service of the United
States under the following named officers
and served as herein stated that he entered
the service of the United States on the tenth
day of June 1788 in the County of Charlotte State
of Virginia the place of his then Residence as a Dragoon
Sergeant Major in the Company of Capt Thos
Williams who marched us on through Virginia
by Halifax Courthouse & through Portsmouth City
to the State of North Carolina to Hillsborough
where he joined the headquarters of General Stephens
Bregance, the officer commanding the Regiment
not recollecting but recollects Capt Wm Richards
& Lucas & Majors Morris & Bayle & with whom
he served during his term of service in the State
of North Carolina until Discharged at Guilford
Courthouse in said State some time in the last
of November following making his term of service
five months and that he entered the said service
the second time in the month of July 1789
as a Dragoon Private in the said County of
Charlotte Virginia where he still resided in
Capt Andrew Wallaf's Company who marched
us to Hillsborough ^{where} in North Carolina to the
Headquarters of General Stephens with whom
he served
