Declaration  
in order to obtain the benefit of the act  
of Congress of the 7th July 1838 entitled  
an act granting half pay and pensions to  
certain widows  
State of Kentucky  
County of Barry

On this eighth day  
of April, eighteen hundred and thirtyfour  
person ally appeared before the Barry County  
Court, Alley Hague, a resident in the  
County of Barry (aged twentyeight years  
who being first duly sworn according  
to Law both in her oath, make the fol-  
lowing declaration, in order to obtain the  
benefit of the provisions made by the act  
of Congress passed July 7 1838 entitled an  
act granting half pay and pensions to  
certain widows, that she is the widow  
of Andrew Hague, who was a Revolutionary  
Soldier, and being a person of intemperate  
hall as per annexed for life under the act  
of 1818 or 1820 & annexed act of Congress she  
further testifies that she was married to the  
said Andrew Hague, on the twentyfourth  
day of March in the year, seventeen hundred  
and eightyfive, that her husband the aforesaid  
Andrew Hague, died on the twentyfourth  
day of July eighteen hundred and thirtyeight

that she was not married to him prior to  
his leaving the service but the marriage  
took place previous to the first of January  
seventeen hundred and thirty five (1835) at  
the time above stated, sworn to and  
subscribed in the day and year above writ-  
ten before <sup>the</sup> Justices of said Court  
Alley Hogue

Also at the same time and place personally  
appeared before the said County Court of said  
District of Missouri aged twenty one years a resident  
of Kansas County Mo. and it shall be attested in due form  
of Law that she is sister to Alley Hogue who  
has sworn & subscribed to the above Declaration  
in order to obtain the benefits of the act of  
Congress passed 7th of July 1835, granting help  
pay & pensions to certain soldiers & their families  
in the month of March seventeen hundred  
and eighty five. Alley went off with Andrew Hogue  
for the purpose to get married as he understood  
by all the family as his father was against their  
marrying. Hogue & I were a day or two with his father  
sent for his sister Alley & her husband as was then  
called Andrew Hogue to come home which  
they did & was then received by all their friends and  
relations of mother mother's sister & brother and was  
then & there recognized as man & wife and  
shortly afterwards they the said Andrew Hogue  
& his wife Alley went to Kansas keeping & he  
lived with them in the same <sup>house</sup> for  
several years & have always since that time  
under the breath of his husband Andrew  
Hogue consider him a successful man &  
never sworn to & subscribed the date above  
mentioned

Know all men by these presents that I Nathan Coffey of the County of Cass and State of Kentucky the administrator of the estate of Ally Wogue deceased widow of Andrew Wogue deceased

That in consideration of some good cause, as fully constituted ~~and appointed~~ of Washington City my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to procure all papers and documents on file in any department or office of Government upon which an application was made for a pension by the said Ally Wogue deceased in her lifetime from the County of Cass and State of Kentucky for the benefit of the pension Act of Congress passed July 4<sup>th</sup> 1838

And on account of the services of her husband the said Andrew Wogue deceased in the Revolutionary war and to obtain by all lawful means any and all amounts of pension money and benefits due her the said Ally Wogue deceased from the United States by virtue of said service

Under any Act of Congress heretofore passed said attorney or attorneys within and in my name to file additional evidence or argument and to do all lawful acts and things whatsoever touching the premises with full power of substitution, fully, continuously and exclusively all other powers of attorney may have been given in the premises and do Vest the same in said attorney here appointed said

be placed on the pension list under the act of 18th  
March 1818.

On this day the 14th of  
September AD 1809 Personally appeared in Court being  
a Court of Record for the County of Casey & State aforesaid  
and established by statute under the Constitution of the  
aforesaid State, Andrew Hogue, resident citizen of said  
County about sixty seven years of age, who being first  
duly sworn according to law - doth on his Oath, make  
the following declaration in order to obtain the provision  
made by the act of Congress of the 18th March 1818. and  
1st May 1820 that he the said Andrew Hogue enlisted for the  
term of Twelve months on the 27th February 1787 in the  
State of North Carolina in the Company commanded  
by Captain Samuel Jones in the Regiment commanded  
by Colonel John Armstrong & Arch Little in the line of the  
State of North Carolina in the Continental establishment  
that he continued to serve in said Corps for the Twelve  
months, when he was discharged by Major Thomas  
Donniche and his discharge he by lot or misplaced - that he  
heretofore relinquished every claim whatever to a pension except  
the present that his name is not on the Roll of any State  
(except the State of Kentucky) And that the following are the  
reasons for not making earlier application for a pension  
to wit: That in the year 18 - an affidavit was made & duly  
certified which is placed in the hands of a friend which  
was lost & misplaced and the absence & difficulty of making  
proof of his service & with the failure in proof of an  
application before within 4 years has prevented earlier  
applications - And in pursuance of the act of the 1st  
May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a resident

Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818  
and that I have not, since that time by gift, sale or  
in any manner disposed of my property or any thereof  
with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself  
within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An  
Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land &  
Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary  
War?" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that  
I have not nor had any person in trust for me any property  
or securities, Contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any  
income, other than what is contained in the Schedule  
hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. Twenty five acres  
of land worth \$2500 is 150¢ Twenty five acres land worth  
75¢ Fifty acres land worth 125¢ Twenty one hogs worth  
10¢ Fourteen sheep worth 4.00 One mare Horse worth 55¢  
One Cow & Calf worth 6¢ Total Value 300¢ 00 cents.

That since the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 the following changes  
have been made in my property. One Cupboard and  
Table two Cows one Calf the value of 50¢ given to my  
Daughter & such property as the same have disposed I do  
not recollect particularly. And all have been disposed  
of for the use of myself and family in consumption & the  
payments of my debts. He states his occupa-  
tion is Farming. That from his age and bodily disability  
he is unable to labour but little. That he has a wife  
& One Child a daughter with him his wife's name is Alley  
aged 65 Years his child's name is Polly aged 17 Years  
neither of whom are much enabled to aid him in  
his occupation. I have declared on the day & date  
above written before the Justices of the County Court  
for the County of Casey & State of Kentucky
