Original Claim

Declaration in order to be placed on the pension list under
the act of the 18th March 1818.
Kentucky County of Casey &c

On this the 28th day of
February 1825. Personally appeared in open Court
being a Court of Record for the County of Casey &c reading
according to the Constitution of the State of Kentucky
William Jones resident in said County aged seventy
five years, who being first duly sworn according
to Law, doth, and he doth, make the following
declaration, in order to obtain the provision made
by the act of Congress, of the 18th March 1818 and the
1st May 1820. that he, the said William Jones, enlisted
for the term of two years on the twenty second day of
February in the year 1776 in the state of Virginia
in the Company commanded by Captain Thomas Heistering
in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Nathl. Buckner
in the line of the state of Virginia in the 6th Virginia
Regiment Continental establishment; that he continued
to serve in the said Corps until the year 1778 when he was
discharged from the service, in February 1778 in the state
of Pennsylvania (Valley Forge) that he hereby relinquishes
every claim whatever to a pension, except the present, that
his name is not on the roll of any state (except Kentucky)
and that the following are the reasons for not making earlier
application for a pension. To wit, He states that the
business was by him put into the hands of his friends in the
year 1818 who failed to pay attention to the same & from
misconception of the person who drafted the 1st Application
and in pursuance of the act of the 1st May 1820
do so hereby swear, that he was a resident Citizen of the United
States on the 18th day of March 1818, and that he has not since
that time, by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of any

Property or any part thereof, with intent thereby to diminish
it, placing myself within the provisions of an act of
Congress, entitled, "An act to provide for certain persons
engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United
States, in the Revolutionary War"; passed on the 18th March
1818. And that I have not, nor has any person in
trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts,
and to me; nor have I any income, other, than what is
contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, and by me
subscribed. Viz One set of shot tools worth \$2. or
\$2.11 and 1/2

That, since the 18th of March 1818, the following
changes have been made in my property by such of my
shot tools as I then had with the exception of such as are
from use worn out. I have yet, with other tools supplying
their place my property properly disposed of, to no person
or persons, no sale having taken place, but the sale of my
industry; the proceeds of which I have given to the land of
charity contributed to my support. I have to and declared
on the Twenty Eighth day of February 1825 before the
Jury County Court.

County Court for the aforesaid County of Casey. Do hereby
certify that it appears to the satisfaction of the Court
that the said William Jones did serve in the Revolu-
tionary War, as stated in the foregoing declaration against
the Common enemy, for the term of nine months, under
one engagement, on the Continental establishment. I
also certify, that the foregoing oath, and the schedule
thereto annexed, are truly copied from the records
of the

Rev. and 1812 War Section.

Madam:

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 35483, it appears that William Jones enlisted February 28, 1776 and served as a private in Captains Thomas Hutchins' and Peter Dunn's Company, Colonel Mordecai Buckner's Virginia Regiment, he was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, and Mud Island Fort, and served until February 1778.

He was allowed pension on his application executed February 28, 1825, while a resident of Casey County, Kentucky, aged seventy-five years; at which time he stated "he had neither wife or children living with me", no names given. He died January 17, 1833.
