State of Kentucky, County of Letcher,

Be it remembered that on this  
14th day of September 1809. Personally appeared in open  
Court being a Court of record for the County Court of Letcher  
proceeding according to the principles of the Common  
Law & by Statute Jacob Mingo a resident Citizen of the  
County aforesaid about 70 years being first duly sworn  
according to law doth on his Oath make the following  
declaration in Order to obtain the provision made  
by the acts of Congress of 18th March 1818 and 7th of  
May 1820 that he said Jacob Mingo enlisted as a private  
soldier for the term of Eighteen Months on the day of  
in the year 1788 in the state of Virginia in the  
Company of Capt. Wm. C. Commanded by Captain Harris  
in the regiment Commanded by Colonel Davis in the  
line of the state of Virginia Con-Continental establishment  
that he continued to serve in 5<sup>th</sup> Corps until he was  
transferred to Capt. Thompson's Company under whom  
he continued to serve & attached to other battalions  
occasionally when he was honorably discharged at  
Gallibury from the service in the State of North Carolina  
on the 18 of January 1780 which discharge is herewith  
filed as part of his application, that he hereby  
relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension except  
the present that his name is not on the pension Roll  
of any state and that the following are the reasons  
for not making an earlier application for a pension, that  
he has until a short time past been able to support himself  
by his labor and while he was in that condition he was  
unwilling to take the humiliating Oath as to indigence  
Circumstances (altho he was poor but preferred maintaining  
himself while he was able to do so, and in pursuance of  
the Act of the 7<sup>th</sup> May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I will

a resident citizen of the United States of America on the 18th day of March 1878 And that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Act of Congress entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed 18th March 1878. And I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed Total 100 acres of Poor land worth \$5 more two horses back worth \$6 and no more two Cows & Calves worth \$14 no more totals Twenty Six Dollars his occupation is a farmer and that he is unable to pursue it he has no family but himself his wife having died some years ago, and his children married many years ago left him - that there has been no changes in his property since the 18th March 1878 except the usual changes in a small stock for family use he owned the same land then he does now that owned no other land since that time, nor has made any change other than stated above except he has purchased one of the horses he now owns for which he is in debt
