Declaration in Order to obtain the benefit of
the Act of Congress passed June 9th 1832
State of Kentucky etc
County of Barry

On the 20th day of August 1832 personally
appeared in open Court before the Honorable
John L. Bridges Judge of the County Circuit
Court now sitting John Brether a Resident
of Barry County of State of Kentucky age
seventy three years who being first duly sworn
according to Law doth on his oath make
the following Declaration, in order to obtain
the benefit of the Act of Congress passed
June 9th 1832 that he takes the service
of the United States under the following
Manner and served as follows: That
about the first of February 1781 he joined Capt
McAdams Company of militia in Rockingham County
Virginia as substitute for Thomas Waugh
the Commander of Regiment to which he belonged
that he never deserted or went over to the
Confederate Army who march as follows
from Rockingham North Carolina to General Green's
Head Quarters served under General Green
until discharged which was on September
in North Carolina, for a term of two months
and about the first of May following he entered
the service of the United States around this time under
Capt Chapman of substitute for the specific
of Thomas Waugh of Rockingham County Virginia and
was attached to Col. Lindley's Regiment of
General Davids Brigade Marched from
Rockingham Court house on by command to
old Lexington & had a night engagement with
the British at that place from Lexington
on March to March 1811 & there was marching
by General Lawson for a term of three months.

He returned home to Amherst County & in
June 1863 was called out to perform his duty
as drafted militiaman. He left the town
of the United States the third time about the
middle of August 1863 in Amherst County
Virginia under Capt. Sandum who marched
through Buchanan & Williamson to Franklin
General Washington's Headquarters having been
crossing the Blue Ridge and after the
disorder of Cramers army he served as
one of the leaders of the prisoners upon their
march near Winchester Virginia & was then
taken sick & was discharged for three months
making his whole service eight months.

That he has no documentary evidence and that
he thinks of no person where testimony he can
precise who can testify to his service.

The only distinguishing mark I can state is a
penance or amity except the present and
declares that his name is not on the pension
roll of the agency of any state
known to & submitted the day & year aforesd

We John Portman a citizen residing
in Lenoir County and Joseph Coffey residing
in the same County certify that we are
well acquainted with John Peppittree who
has furnished and shown to the above named
sixteen that we believe him to be seventy five
years of age that he is infirm and resides
and then in the High Knobhood where he
claims to have been a soldier of the Revolu-
tion and that we know in that opinion

Know all men by these presents
that we John Rially & William Sampson
are held & firmly bound unto his Excellency
James Garrard Esq; Governor of Kentucky
in the sum of fifty pounds Current Money
for the payment of which we bind our-
selves our heirs & jointly & severally firmly
by these presents sealed with our seals &
dated this 24th day of January 1803.

The condition of the above
obligation is such that whereas there is
a marriage shortly intended to be solemnized
between the above bound John Rially &
Sally Sage for which a license is
about to issue. — Now if there is no
lawful cause to obstruct said marriage
then this obligation to be void — else to
remain in full force & virtue in law.

On this 30th day of March 1854 Personally appeared before the undersigned a Justice of the Peace in the County of Collin in the aforesaid State Sally Royalty a resident of Collin County and State aforesaid aged 87 years who, first being duly sworn according to law, doth on her Oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed on the 3rd February 1853 granting pension to Widows of Persons who served during the revolutionary War. That she is the widow of John Royalty who was a Private in the War of the Revolu-
tion, and a pensioner of the United States under Act
1832 on the Kentucky Roll as will more fully appear
by reference to her papers on file in the Pension Office

She further declares that she was married to the said John Royalty on the 25 day of Aug 1803 & D. reference is made to the Marriage Bond & Certificate filed in the pension office for greater certainty. that her said husband died on the 16th day of November A.D 1844 as well as he recollects that she was not married to him prior to the second of January Eighteen Hundred but at the time above stated. She further declares that she is now a Widow. She further states that she supposeth in her Husband's application for a pension it was fault of the Draftsman in spelling his Name Royaltree as he could not write that the sound is somewhat similar. her
