Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of
the act of Congress passed June 9th 1882
State of Kentucky }
County of Barry } 28th

On this 28th day of August 1882 personally
appeared in open Court before the Honorable
John W. Bridges Judge of the Barry Circuit
Court now sitting, John Reath a Resident
of Barry County & State of Kentucky, age
seventy three years who being first duly sworn
according to Law hath on his oath made
the following Declaration, in order to obtain
the benefit of the act of Congress passed
June 9th 1882. That he entered the Service
of the United States under the following
named Officers and served as herein stated
about the first of February 1781 he joined Capt
Mocallus Company of militia in Bushwilt County
Virginia as a substitute for Thomas Waugh
the Commander of Regiment to which he belonged
that he remained on until we arrived
at Saurous Brigade who march us to Bedford
County North Carolina to General Green's
Head Quarters served under General Green
until discharged which was on September
in North Carolina, for term of two months
and about the first of May following returned
the Service of the United States around this time
Capt Franklin of a substitute for the former
Thos Waugh of Bushwilt County Virginia and
was attached to Capt Bridges Regiment of
General Saurous Brigade march from
Bushwilt County on by Richmond to
old Lancaster, I had a night engagement with
the British at that place from Lancaster
we march to Chaulmhill & there was discharged
by General Saurous for term of three months.

Then returned home to seek out beauty & in
June 1861 was called on to perform his duty
as drafted militiaman he entered the service
of the United States the third time about the
middle of August 1861 - in Shenandoah County
Virginia under Capt Sanderson who marched us
through Richmond & Williamsburg to get to town
General Washington's Headquarters having then
besieging the hole siege and after the
surrender of Cornwallis's army he served as
one of the guards of the prisoners on their
march near Winchester Virginia & was there
taken sick & was discharged for three months
making his whole service eight months.

That he has no documentary evidence and that
he knows of no person whose testimony he can
produce who can testify to his service.

are held & firmly bound unto his Excellency
James Garrard Esquire Governor of Kentucky
in the sum of fifty pounds Current Money
for the payment of which We bind our-
selves our heirs & jointly & severally jointly
by these presents Sealed with our seals &
dated this 24th day of January 1808. 1803-

The Condition of the above
obligation is such that Whereas there is
a Marriage shortly intended to be solemnized
between the above bound John Riatty &
Sally Sage for which a license is
about to issue. - Now if there is no
lawful Cause to obstruct said Marriage
then this obligation to be void - else to
remain in full force & virtue in Law

On this 30th day of March 1857 Personally appeared before the undersigned a Justice of the Peace in the County of Cochran in the aforesaid State Sally Roy atty a resident of Cochran County and State aforesaid aged 87 years who, first being duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the Act of Congress, passed on the 3rd February 1853. granting pensions to widows of persons who served during the revolutionary war. that she is the widow of John Roy atty who was a private in the War of the Revolution, and a pensioner of the United States under Act 1832 on the Kentucky Roll as will more fully appear by reference to his papers on file in the Pension Office.

She further declares that she was married to the said John Roy atty on the 25 day of May 1808 &c. reference is made to the Marriage Bond & Certificate filed in the Pension Office for greater certainty, that her said husband died on the 16 day of ~~November~~ ^{December} 1844 as well as she recollects, that she was not married to him prior to the second of January Eighteen Hundred but at the time above stated, she further declares that she is now a widow. she further states that she supposes that in her husband's application for a pension it was fault of the draftsman in spelling his name Roy attree as he could not write, that the sound is somewhat similar. her
